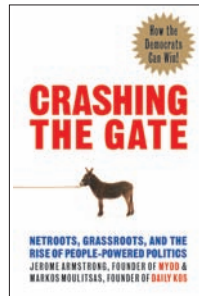
**AN UNREASONABLE WOMAN:**

Wilson launched a campaign against the multibillion-dollar corporation that had been dumping ethylene dichloride and vinyl chloride into the bays of the Gulf Coast, then covering it up and silencing its workers. Wilson took to the gates of the chemical plant and to the courts, encountering scorn, bribery, character assassination, and death threats. 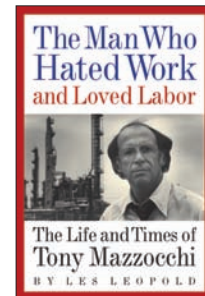
