Indeed, Sy Montgomery is one of the most celebrated wildlife authors and adventurers of our time, and her rare gift is chronicling the lives of little-known animals and the humans that live alongside them.

Prompted by demand for Montgomery's earlier work after her national bestseller *The Good, Good Pig*, Chelsea Green is releasing revised editions of two classics--*Spell of the Tiger: The Man-Eaters of Sundarbans* and *Journey of the Pink Dolphin: An Amazon Quest*.

JOURNEY OF THE PINK DOLPHINS

Journey of the Pink Dolphins brings readers on a mysterious journey into the Amazon to find the ethereal and rarely recorded pink dolphin. Known to locals who live along its Amazon waterways as botos, these dolphins are shrouded in both mystery and lore. Montgomery tracks the elusive botos through both the open Amazon waters and through the flooded Amazonian rainforest, where the dolphins dance and weave through treetops.

In the updated *Journey of the Pink Dolphins*, Montgomery takes readers on four separate journeys, exploring the river-dwelling dolphins' natural history, chronicling their conservation pressures, unraveling their prehistoric roots, and listening to the tales of locals who reveal a mythical, enchanted world.

SPELL OF THE TIGER

Spell of the Tiger, a work that won numerous book awards and spawned a National Geographic documentary on Montgomery's work—brings readers to the Sundarbans, a remote but vast tidal delta that lies between India and Bangladesh. There, tigers routinely eat people, behaving like no other tigers on earth but still earning the respect and reverence of the villagers that often become their prey.

Through her story, Montgomery reveals the delicate balance of Sundarbans life, exploring the mix of worship and fear that offers tigers unique protection there, and unlocking some surprising answers about why people at risk of becoming prey might consider their predator a god. What she reveals about the relationship between the people and tigers of the Sundarbans is as magic as the tangled mangrove swamp itself. Her updates and postscript in this revised edition bring readers a fresh perspective on tigers in the Sundarbans and around the world.

She has worked in a pit crawling with 18,000 snakes in Manitoba, been hunted by a tiger in India, swum with pink dolphins in the Amazon, and been undressed by an orangutan in Borneo. She is the author of 13 award-winning books, including her national best-selling memoir, *The Good Good Pig*. Montgomery lives in Hancock, New Hampshire.
